Romeo and Juliet Essay Assignment

Choose to write a 5 paragraph essay **OR** give a powerpoint presentation on one of the topics below. **Due May 17**

- Shakespeare was the master of figurative language. Consider how the use of metaphor, simile, hyperbole and/or personification contributes to the meaning of one of the play's longer speeches. Analyze the speech and explain its figurative language.
- 2. Discuss the relationships between parents and children in Romeo and Juliet. How do Romeo and Juliet interact with their parents? Are they rebellious in the modern sense? How do their parents feel about them?
- 3. In the Prologue, Romeo and Juliet are described as "star-crossed lovers" and reference is made to their "death-marked love". They themselves speak like this. Do you think that Shakespeare wants to create the impression that their death is brought about by a cruel overwhelming Fate, by sheer accident or by their own willfulness or by some or all of these?
- 4. Explore how Shakespeare uses imagery to intensify the drama and highlight the central themes.
- 5. Who is responsible for the tragedy of Romeo and Juliet? Friar Laurence? The two lovers themselves? Their parents? Do a number of people share the blame? To what extent can these people be held responsible for the deaths of Romeo and Juliet? Analyze the actions of the character(s) you think are responsible for the lovers' deaths.
- 6. Analyze the characters of the Nurse and Friar Laurence as mentors to the young people in the play. Do these two people do the "right thing" in their relationships with Romeo and Juliet?
- The essay must include two quotations for each body paragraph and be 500-700 words in length, double-spaced. Review "How to write an essay"
- The presentation must include all components of an essay: an introduction, 3 supporting ideas, and a conclusion. There must be two quotations from the play for each supporting idea. The slides can be in point form (with pictures!), and you will give more detail and explanation during the presentation.
- Each student must complete a detailed essay outline, due on May 14
